#### **Trustee Profile**

#### Roman M. Sazonov '05 MA

Roman M. Sazonov '05 MA

Roman was born and raised in Moscow, Russia. After graduating from high school in 1995, Roman was admitted to the Moscow State Linguistic University. Although music was not

Roman's strength, he formed the first University band, which continued far beyond Roman's time at the University. During Roman's sophomore year, he was offered an opportunity to be a Teaching Associate of the Russian language at Williams College, MA for a period of one year. It was Roman's first trip to the United States, and, in fact, abroad. Roman enjoyed the quiet, beautiful and academically challenging campus life at Williams as he taught Russian to the Williams students. Together with his students, Roman produced a short film staged a play, and reduced a short film staged a play and

duced a short film, staged a play, and ran a weekly radio show to promote the Russian language study at the College.

Roman enjoyed his experience at Williams very much so he decided to transfer from his University in Moscow to Williams College and finish his education there. As a result, Roman transitioned from a faculty member to a student. Due to Roman's interest in ancient history Roman's major at Williams became the study of the Classical Civilizations, ancient languages, and archaeology. Roman's first hands-on experience of ancient cultures was when he pursued an eighteen month program at the University of Salamanca in Spain, where he became fluent in Spanish, participated in his first archaeological excavations, and traveled extensively throughout Europe.

Upon Roman's graduation from Williams College in 2001, Roman was hired by the Institute of Classical Archaeology at the University of Texas in Austin. After a series of excavations at an ancient site on the Crimean Peninsula in the Black Sea, the University was working on a book project, where Roman was instrumental in research and translation of the historical sources primarily in Russian. Once the project was over,

and the first ever publication in English about the Greco-Roman occupation of the Crimean peninsula and the birthplace of Russian Christianity was produced, Roman was admitted into a gradu-

ate program in Classical Art and Archaeology at Yale University. Roman fell in love with Yale and its multinational fellowship of scholars. If Roman could have Florida weather at Yale, he would have never moved. As Roman pursued the program at Yale, he led excavation teams to Spain, and traveled extensively in the Mediterranean. It was during those years that Roman developed a passion for travel photography which resulted in several contest awards and local publications. During

Roman's last year at Yale, he met his wonderful wife, Asia, and they got married at the Marquand Chapel with many Yale friends attending their wedding.

Upon Asia and Roman's graduation from Yale, they moved to Washington D.C. for Roman's internship with the History Channel's 'Digging for the Truth' and National Geographic Expeditions. Roman was involved in the research, story writing, translations, and on-site filming. Later that year, Roman and Asia left Washington due to family circumstances and moved to Fort Myers. Roman had always been interested in business, and the relocation presented him with new opportunities. He was hired as a Business Consultant for Apple Inc. and was involved in the opening of two Apple stores in Bonita Springs and Naples. Soon thereafter, Roman was hired by a major investment firm where he works now with a successful team of financial planners and investment advisors. Besides work, Roman and Asia enjoy the weather in Florida, like to travel, and are active in their church. One day, Roman is still dreaming of hosting a history and travel show, called 'Roaming with Roman'.

## Executive Administrator Profile Robert D. Bush

Robert "Bob" Bush was born and raised in Brackenridge, PA. Bob received a B.S in Business Administration from Grove City College in Grove City, PA. While at Grove City he met Jerilyn Ann Helm whom he married in 1968.

Prior to his retirement in 1999, Bob held the position of Director of Procurement for the Portsmouth and the Paducah Uranium Enrichment Facilities in Portsmouth, Ohio. 

#### Alumni Schools Committee Starts New Season

The Alumni Schools Committee is ready for the new season of interviews for Yale admissions. Our activities started on September 18<sup>th</sup> at the Golden Gate High School where the Collier County College Night took place. Scott Herstin and I manned a table where we represented Yale from 3:30 till 7:00 p.m. There were about 100 plus colleges represented.

The admissions department supplies us with hand out material about Yale and New Haven. We direct the students to look up the Yale web site as it contains a vast amount of information and also the application for admission. The process of manning the Yale table is almost non stop from the time the gym is opened to the students. All Collier students from both public and private schools are invited to attend College Night. We try to answer all the questions about Yale and their admissions requirements and I must admit it taxes our ability to let the students know how difficult it is to be admitted to Yale. Yale is looking for the very best and it is sometimes difficult to quantify the criteria in terms that a student might understand. We do our best.

Early in October we have been advised that there are applicants needing a personal interview. So far we have two, one from Bishop Verot in Fort Myers and one from the Community School of Naples. In the days ahead there will be many more. Of particular urgency will be the "early action" applicants as these interviews must be completed by December first.

There were 1952 students admitted.

There were 1352 students that matriculated.

The balance of males and females is about even.

The SAT averages came out to 1500.

55.9 percent are on financial aid.
